## Mallet finger injury: discharge advice

You have torn the tendon that normally straightens the end joint of the finger.
 The tendon may even pull off a small fragment of bone



- The tendon will heal without an operation providing you wear the splint continuously for
  6-8 weeks and 2 further weeks at night.
- A splint will be applied to keep the finger in a straight position with the end joint slightly extended.
- It is very important that the end joint does not bend during the splinted period.
- When you remove the splint to wash your finger, you must hold it straight on a flat surface and **not allow it to bend**.
- Mallet fractures may leave a small bump on the top of your finger and may result in some loss of movement in the joint.
- Redness, tenderness and swelling are common for 3 to 4 months, but will settle.
- Occasionally the tendon fails to heal; it can be treated by further splinting and possible surgical repair, although most fingers function well despite a droop at the end joint.

## Things to look out for:

If you experience any of the following and they are not improved by loosening the tape used to hold the splint on please return to the Emergency Department for review: -

- Worsening swelling
- Numbness
- Worsening pain
- Tingling

**If your Splint becomes loose or uncomfortable** – please contact the Emergency Department, so it can be checked and replaced if necessary.
