Under 1 vo Senior Review

Dear Colleagues,

Infants (Under 1yr Olds) are recognized as a group of patients who are at a higher risk level due to various reasons. Hence we recommend them to be reviewed by a Senior Clinician.

When we re-audited this practice this year, 21.5% of infants seen by a Junior were not offered this service.

Senior Clinicians = ED Consultants, ED Registrars/MGs, Paeds Consultants, Paeds Registrars, Paeds Advanced Nurse Practitioners.

Could I kindly request you all to ensure all Infants presenting to our EDs are reviewed by a Senior Clinician before they are discharged.

Junior colleagues are advised to discuss all Infants with a senior. Senior clinician will make the judgment call whether to review the infant themselves or give verbal advice.

However there are **10 definitive indications** in which it is **highly recommended** for the senior **to review** the patient themselves.

- 1. All with fever
- 2. All with PAWS score >4
- 3. All neonates (less than 28days old)
- 4. All known to social services (including any family member known to services)
- 5. All with burns
- 6. All with suspected skull fractures
- 7. All with long bone fractures (excluding elbow, wrist, knee & ankle fractures)
- 8. All non-mobile infants with injuries*
- 9. Returning with same problem within 72hrs
- 10. Any concerning presentations

*ALL non-mobile infants with any injury/burn regardless of the mechanism NEED discussing with the Consultant Paediatrician as well, who then will decide if further review/investigations are needed in terms of NAI/safeguarding.

The outcome of the conversation and Consultant name should be documented in the notes.

After review/ discussion, the **encounter should be documented in EPR** notes as a separate entry titled as "Senior Review". It's recommended to use "ED Senior Review Notes" for this purpose. This should be ideally done by the Senior Clinician; however, the Junior Clinician could do it on behalf of them. Senior should check that note and endorse it in an addendum with any corrections/ additions if needed.
