Group A Strep Update (15 Dec)

Sore Throats Use FeverPAIN Score:



NICE guidance



If score 3 or more: prescribe antibiotics

Scarlet Fever

Clinical Diagnosis: sore throat, headache, fever, nausea / vomting, white tongue then strawberry, neck glands, facial flushing with perioral pallor, peeling skin on fingers, sandpaper rash

NICE guidance



Treatment: 10/7 antibiotics

Invasive Group A Strep

Rare but severe

Consider if features of bacterial pneumonia and recent / current GAS infection or recently in contact

Treatment: as per sepsis

Throat Swabs

Only in diagnostic uncertainty / 1st line treatment failure Or Invasive GAS to aid culture / sensitivity

Treatment

 1st line: Pen V (if no liquid can use crushed tablets) Alternatives: Amoxicillin, Macrolides, Cefalexin
Co-trimoxazole option if severe penicillin allergy and no macrolide Length: 5 days for symptomatic cure (most sore throats)
10 days for microbiological cure (some throats and scarlet fever)
